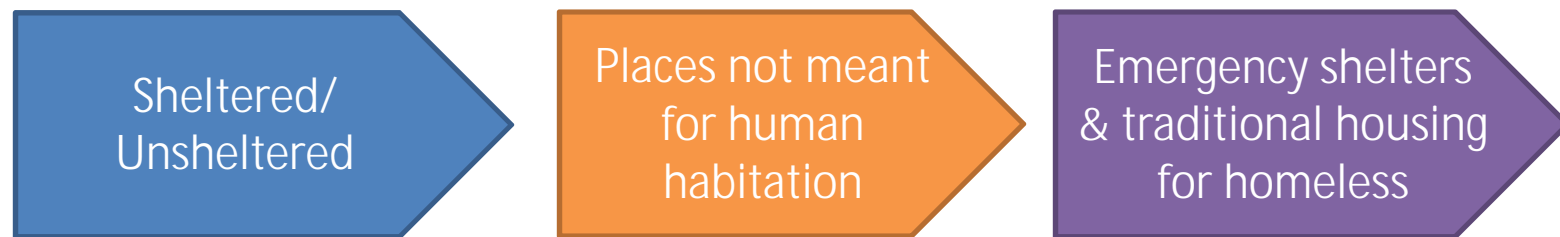

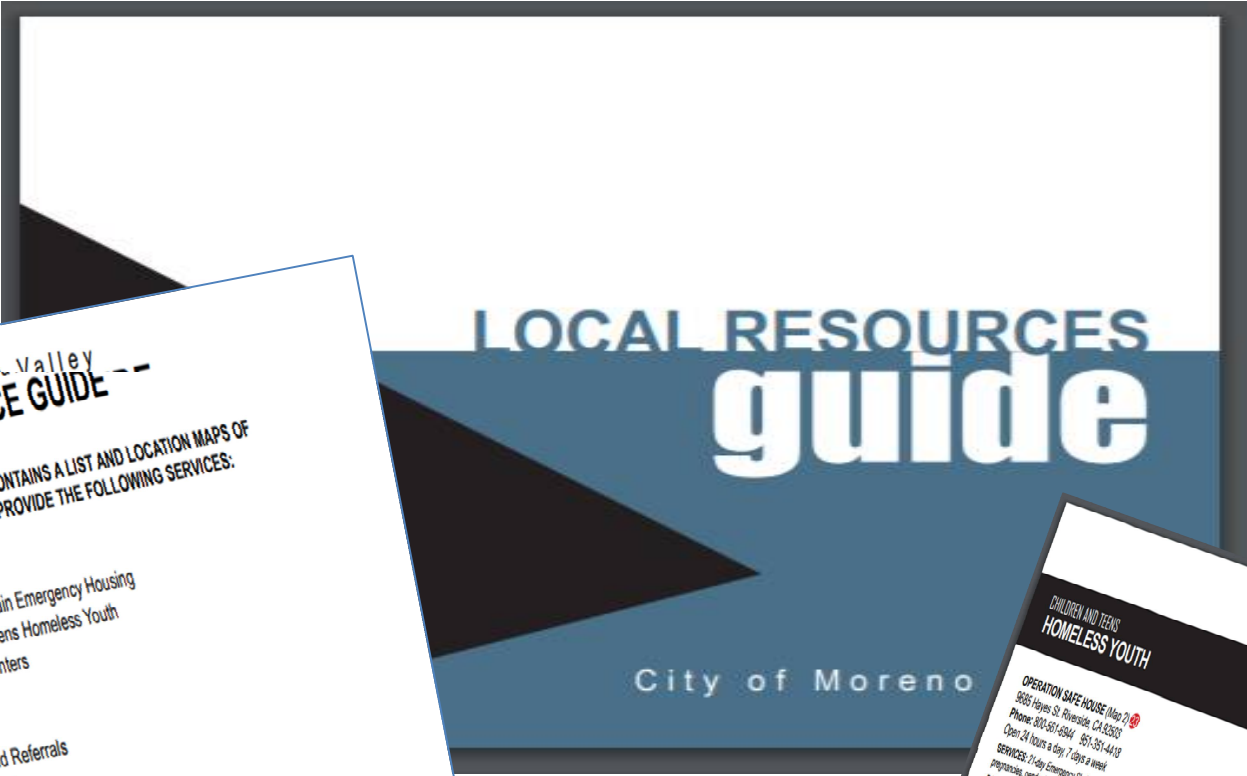

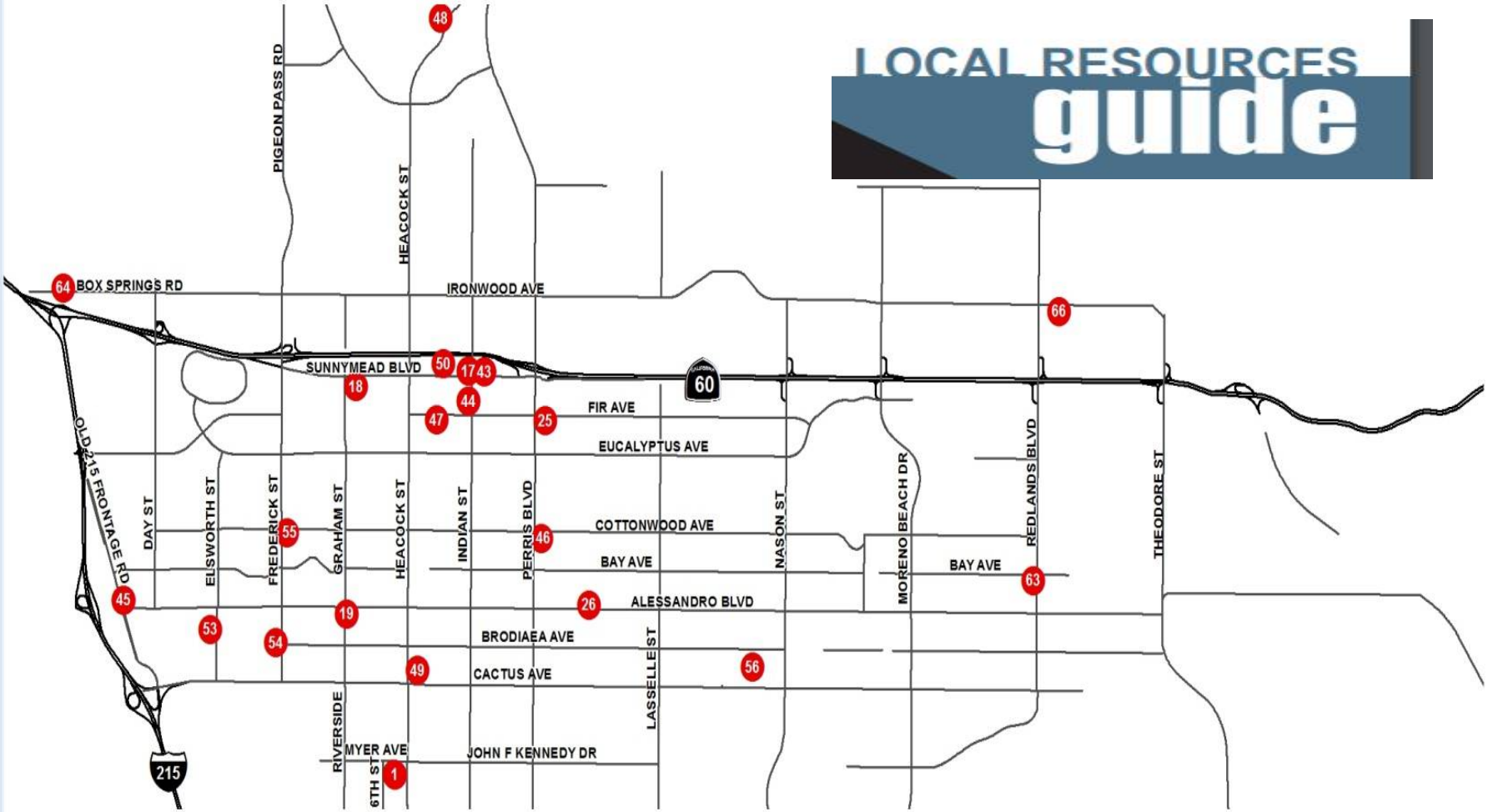

- Maximum 90 days in program.
- Must go through HMIS intake process.
- Assistance on driver license, social security card, ID card, referral to other services.
