| <b>1. COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (CAP) - COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM – (951) 485-7792</b>  | <b>\$15,000</b>  |
| Provides emergency and supplemental food and referrals to families and individuals in need. Also provides clothing and utility payment assistance when available.   |                  |
| <b>2. FAMILY SERVICE ASSOCIATION (FSA) – MORE THAN A MEAL– (951) 342-3057</b>   | <b>\$10,000</b>  |
| Provides hot meals in a group setting at the Moreno Valley Senior Center and delivers to homebound seniors/elderly to help with basic nutritional needs and well-being.   |                  |
| <b>3. FRIENDS OF MORENO VALLEY SENIOR CENTER – MO VAN - (951) 358-9202</b>  | <b>\$35,000</b>  |
| The “MoVan” is a specially equipped 14-passenger van designed to transport the elderly and adult handicapped to medical and other appointments within a 35 mile radius, at low or no cost.  |                  |
| <b>4. RIVERSIDE AREA RAPE CRISIS CENTER - CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM – (951) 686-7273</b>   | <b>\$10,000</b>  |
| Provides abuse prevention and education programs to children and adults through the Moreno Valley schools.  |                  |
| <b>5. TIME FOR CHANGE FOUNDATION – COMMUNITY HOMELESS SOLUTIONS PROJECT – (909) 886-2994</b>  | <b>\$10,000</b>  |
| The Foundation provides substance abuse treatment and supportive services including Case Management and follow-up to the homeless in collaboration with Hole in the Wall, Inc.  |                  |
| <b>6. U.S. VETERANS INITIATIVE – HOMELESS VETERANS EMERGENCY SHELTER PROGRAM - (951) 269-1119</b>   | <b>\$15,000</b>  |
| Funding is used to provide meals for homeless veterans housed at the facility located on March Air Force Reserve Base.  |                  |
| <b>7. VOICES FOR CHILDREN – COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE (CASA) PROGRAM – (858) 569-2019</b>  | <b>\$25,000</b>  |
| Provides recruitment, training, and supervision of CASA volunteers who serve as advocates for foster children. The one on one mentoring allows for effective and individualized advocacy.   |                  |
| <b>8. FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL - FAIR HOUSING DISCRIMINATION SERVICES/LANDLORD TENANT COUNSELING - (951) 653-8314</b>   | <b>\$49,532</b>  |
| Provides no-cost education, training and technical assistance, enforcement and investigation of fair housing discrimination complaints along with free dispute resolution and mediation services for both tenants and landlords dealing with rental issues. |                  |
| <b>9. MORENO VALLEY POLICE DEPT – NEIGHBORHOOD POLICING PROGRAM/OPERATION HOLIDAY CHEER – (951) 486-6700</b>  | <b>\$54,000</b>  |
| Designed to bring law enforcement to a personal community level in order to solve neighborhood problems. Funding will go towards members of the Problem Oriented Policing (POP) team to work within the CDBG designated area.                               |                  |
| <b>10. CITY OF MORENO VALLEY-MORENO VALLEY EMPLOYMENT RESOURCE CENTER - (951) 413-3920</b>  | <b>\$66,000</b>  |
| The City of Moreno Valley provides computers, internet access, resume preparation, employment search assistance, and unemployment benefit application services free of charge to job seekers and the unemployed.  |                  |
| <b>11. GRID ALTERNATIVES – SOLAR ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM- (951) 471-7045</b>  | <b>\$24,000</b>  |
| Provides installation of solar electric systems to low income families, and installs them using a model that gives volunteers and job trainee’s hands-on solar installation experience at no-cost.  |                  |
| <b>12. CITY OF MORENO VALLEY-NEIGHBORHOOD CODE ENFORCEMENT/RENTAL PROPERTY INSPECTION PROGRAM - (951) 413-3340</b>  | <b>\$339,440</b> |
| City Code Compliance staff provides proactive enforcement including city codes, ordinances and rental properties within the CDBG Target Areas.  |                  |

- 13. SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER (University Enterprises Corp) - COUNSELING SERVICE - (951) 781-2345** **\$50,000**

Provides business consulting and training services to existing and start-up business enterprises within the City of Moreno Valley. Topics include: start-up, QuickBooks, marketing, time management, operations, HR, financing, business plan development, marketing strategy and social media utilization.
- 14. CITY OF MORENO VALLEY - PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION - (951) 413-3450** **\$386,552**

The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall CDBG grant program and reports to the Office of Housing and Urban Development on program outcomes. This includes project selection, overseeing of subrecipients, environmental reviews, special studies, all program reporting and monitoring.
- 15. CITY OF MORENO VALLEY- FARRAGUT AVE FROM SHERMAN AVE TO ELSWORTH ST. - (951) 413-3150** **\$561,237**

The project includes the construction of sidewalk, curb, gutter, and pavement repair on both sides of Farragut Avenue from Sherman Ave to Elsworth Street to enhance safety and ADA compliance.
- 16. CITY OF MORENO VALLEY – MARCH FIELD PARK ANNEX ROOF IMPROVEMENTS - (951) 413-3726** **\$42,000**

The project will replace the roof at one of the City’s public facilities for a future youth center.
- 17. CITY OF MORENO VALLEY- CYCLE 6 ADA PEDESTRIAN RAMP IMPROVEMENTS- (951) 413-3146** **\$375,000**

The project includes the design of 24 access ramps throughout the City’s CDBG target areas to meet current ADA standards.

**HOME PROGRAMS/PROJECTS**

- 1. HOME PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION - (951) 413-3450** **\$52,730**

The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall HOME grant program and reports to the Office of Housing and Urban Development on program outcomes. This includes project selection, overseeing of subrecipients, environmental reviews, special studies, all program reporting and monitoring.
- 2. CHDO (COMMUNITY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION) HOUSING - (951) 413-3450** **\$79,095**

Each year HUD requires that 15% of the annual allocation be reserved for affordable housing projects to be developed by a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO).
- 3. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY – MOBILE HOME REPAIR PROGRAM - (951) 787-6754** **\$120,000**

This program provides a grant of up to \$10,000 to income qualified owner-occupants of mobile homes to make necessary repairs both interior and exterior. Repairs will first address correction of code, health and safety violations.

**ESG PROGRAMS/PROJECTS**

- 1. ESG PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION - (951) 413-3450** **\$13,639**

The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall ESG grant program and reports to the Office of Housing and Urban Development on program outcomes. This includes project selection, overseeing of subrecipients, environmental reviews, special studies, all program reporting and monitoring.
- 2. COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE-HOMELESS MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM (HMIS)- (951) 358-5636** **\$5,000**

City contribution to support the ESG client tracking software required by HUD for grant data collection and reporting.
- 3. CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF SAN BERNARDINO & RIVERSIDE-CASEWORK SERVICES PROGRAM- (909) 388-1239** **\$68,000**

Provides case management services to homeless and those at risk of homelessness, including community outreach, and homeless prevention services, motel vouchers, rental assistance, utility assistance, food and other supportive services.
- 4. P.W. ENHANCEMENT CENTER – HOMELESS PREVENTION & RAPID RE-HOUSING – (951) 616-1628** **\$80,213**

P.W.E.C. will provide services to homeless persons and those at risk of homelessness, including rental assistance, security deposits, arrears assistance, motel vouchers, emergency food and case management.
- 5. U.S. VETERANS INITIATIVE – HOMELESS VETERANS EMERGENCY SHELTER PROGRAM – (951) 269-1119** **\$15,000**

Program will provide emergency shelter and supportive services at the March Air Force Base.
