



We are pleased to provide you with a brief update on recent activities within your City's special districts. These special districts were created to provide additional recreational and public services which enhance the quality of life in our community. Moreno Valley's special district programs provide the resources to maintain parkway and median landscaping, street lighting, parks and trails, and provide many recreation and community service programs, including our annual 4th of July Celebration. LANDSCAPING

Drought Tolerant Landscaping Coming

We're leveraging resources and being water wise. The City received a rebate through Metropolitan Water District to upgrade more than 550,000 square feet of public landscaping. Drought tolerant plant materials and an efficient drip irrigation system will replace non-functional turf in public landscape areas irrigated with potable water. Estimated project completion is February 2016.

Recycled Water Used in Parkway & Median Landscaping

When possible, the City uses recycled water to irrigate public landscaped parkways and medians. In fact, most of the public landscaping in Moreno Valley Ranch is irrigated with recycled water. To view locations where recycled water is used, visit the "Landscape Maintenance" tab at www.moval.org/sf.

Although using recycled water is more cost efficient and environmentally responsible, it also requires regular maintenance of irrigation equipment to prevent breaks or leaks associated with highly chlorinated water.

Special charges collected as part of the property tax bill fund special district programs. Water Conservation Efforts

We are doing our part to conserve water. Between January and October of 2015, the City reduced the amount of potable water it uses for public landscaping by an average of 39.6%, as compared to the same time period in 2014.

In addition to water audits, the City uses high efficiency sprinkler nozzles, weather based smart irrigation controllers, recycled water when available, drought tolerant plant materials and, where possible, drip irrigation. Report a Broken Sprinkler or Irrigation Issue

Your help is vital. Working together, we can minimize water waste, maintain plant health, and reduce water costs. Please report broken sprinklers and other irrigation leaks in the public landscaped parkways and medians. During normal business hours, call 951.413.3480 or use the "Report a Broken Sprinkler" form located on the "Landscape Maintenance" tab at www.moval.org/sf. Normal business hours are Monday thru Thursday, 7:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. and Fridays, 7:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. After hours, call the Moreno Valley Police Department non-emergency line at 951.247.8700.

STREET LIGHTS

Report Street Light Outages

Moreno Valley Utility (MVU) and Southern California Edison (SCE) own, operate, and maintain street lights throughout the City. Each street light has a unique pole number.

MVU street lights have a 3 or 4 digit pole number and end in "MV" or "MVU." The number is located at the base of the pole. Report MVU outages to 1.844.341.6469 or mvutility@moval.org. Please include the location of the street light and pole number, if available.

SCE street lights have a 7 digit pole number, followed by the letter "E." The number is imprinted on a vertical metal strip attached to the pole, just above eye level. Report SCE outages to 1.800.611.1911 or use the SCE Outages mobile app on your smartphone.

Not sure who owns the street light? We're here to help. Call 951.413.3480, email specialdistricts@moval.org, submit a "Street Light Repair Request" from the "Street Lighting" tab at www.moval.org/sf, or use the City of Moreno Valley mobile app for your smartphone. We just need the location of the street light and pole number, if available.

Routine street light repairs are completed by the utility providers in 10-15 working days. Extensive repairs may take up to 30 days. When this is necessary, the utility provider places a colored ribbon around the pole until the repairs are complete.
