



Moreno Valley streets can be safe for all cyclists and motorists. To co-exist safely, we need mutual respect and understanding between cyclists and motorists, as we “Share the Road.” For the Share the Road concept to be effective, it takes actions and responsibilities by both motorists and the cycling community as follows:

The Bicyclist:

- Always wear a helmet. Even though California law requires those under 18 to do so, all bicyclists should wear them while riding.
- Travel in the same direction as traffic.
- Follow the rules of the road and obey all signals and signs.
- Ride within bike lanes when available and always keep as far right as possible..
- Give pedestrians the right of way when in close contact.
- Ride single file to allow motorists to pass safely
- Use hand signals to indicate stops, changes of directions, and turns.
- Use reflective gear and proper lights if riding after dark.

The Motorist:

- Slow down near a bicyclist and give them at least 3 feet when passing them.
- Stay alert and avoid all distractions while driving.
- Be aware of bicyclists when making turns and gauge speeds accordingly.
- Watch for passing bicyclists when exiting a parking space, driveway, or car.
- Avoid honking the horn near bicyclists.
- Take extra care around children on bicycles.
- Remember that a cyclist is legally allowed to take an entire lane when no bike lane exists and there is insufficient width for the vehicle to pass the cyclist safely.

Let’s all be part of the solution by being alert, aware, and most of all - Share the Road. It belongs to all of us!
