

# **ABOUT**

The Moreno Valley Fire Department is the primary response agency for fires, emergency medical services, hazardous materials incidents, traffic accidents, terrorist acts, catastrophic weather events, and technical rescues for the City of Moreno Valley. The Moreno Valley Fire Department is a part of the CALFIRE / Riverside County Fire Department's regional, integrated, and cooperative fire protection and organization.

The Fire Department also provides a full range of fire prevention services including public education, code enforcement, plan check and inspection services for new and existing construction, and fire investigation.

Additionally, the City's Office of Emergency Management is located within the Fire Department allowing for a well-coordinated response to both natural and man-made disasters.

# **OBJECTIVE**



- Consolidated dispatch center for emergency medical and fire dispatch
- Riverside County Fire Office of Emergency Services

### KEY STATISTICS

#### 2023

- 22,647 calls for service
- 0.3% increase from 2020
- Station 6 was the busiest with 5,425 calls
- 77% of calls were medical emergencies

The Fire Prevention Division safeguards the community from fire and environmental hazards through programs designed to reduce the incidences of injuries, loss of life, and loss of property. We do this by ensuring property owners' adherence to fire regulations, providing public education, and conducting hazard mitigation inspections.

# **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

### **OBJECTIVE**

The Fire Department's Office of Emergency Management and Volunteer Services is responsible for minimizing the impact of natural and man-made disasters by establishing readiness through City-wide prevention, preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation.

Readiness includes coordinating and conducting drills for the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) as well as providing a wide variety of training to employees including Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training, and emergency preparedness training.
